THE ROLE - TEACHER OF PE (NETBALL SPECIALIST)

Overall Purpose: To teach PE and Games across both Junior and Senior School, including examination PE at KS4/KS5. To effectively contribute to a busy games programme with a particular focus on girls PE and to support the Department in offering a varied and exciting extra curricular programme.

Reports to: Director of Sport, Head of Senior School PE, Head of Junior School PE.

Key Responsibilities:

- To prepare and teach engaging lessons in line with the agreed curriculum and schemes of work in PE/Games.
- To implement the PE/School assessment policy to track, record and report on pupil progress.
- To teach academic PE at KS4 and/or KS5.
- To contribute to a busy and varied extra curricular programme both before and after school and on occasional weekends.
- To manage and coach school teams across a variety of sports including officiating where applicable.
- To take an active role in leading and supporting the Netball programme.
- To promote and help organise a range of events that enable pupils to further extend their sporting experience whilst also raising the profile of PE/Games.
- To help organise and attend sports tours where appropriate to do so.
- To support the PE Scholarship programme by acting as a mentor to a selected group of pupil's.
- Participate fully and actively in the boarding life of the school with associated duties and responsibilities. Part time staff are expected to take a proportion of these responsibilities.
- Full time members of staff will usually be asked to be a Form Tutor.
- Attend departmental, faculty and full staff meetings on a regular basis.

Key performance measures:

- High level of pupil engagement and participation.
- Strong academic results which reflect the value added to each individual pupil.
- High contribution to extra curricular activities.
- Successful school teams who take pride and enjoyment in representing the school.

- Willingness to upskill to other sport/s
- Coaching and officiating qualifications would be advantageous, particularly in Netball.

- A commitment to continuing professional development.
